
BY-LAW AND STRUCTURE REVIEW

MARGARET BULLITT-JONES
GUEST PREACHER—JULY 1, 2018

An Episcopal priest, author, retreat leader, and climate activist, Margaret Bullitt-Jonas serves as Missioner for Creation Care for both the Episcopal Diocese of Western Massachusetts and Mass. Conference, United Church of Christ. She seeks to inspire and support a wave of religious activism to address the climate crisis, deepen reverence for God's creation, and create a more just and sustainable society.

After graduating from Stanford University (B.A. with honors in Russian literature) and Harvard University (Ph.D. in comparative literature), Margaret turned her life in a new direction: she entered seminary, earned the Masters of Divinity from Episcopal Divinity School, and was ordained in the Episcopal Church. She served as a parish priest for 16 years in the Boston area, and for 9 years at Grace Episcopal Church, in Amherst, Massachusetts. She was a Lecturer in Pastoral Theology at Episcopal Divinity School from 1992-2005. After completing the Spiritual Guidance program of the Shalem Institute for Spiritual Formation in 1988, she offered spiritual direction to individuals for almost two decades. For several years she also served as Chaplain to the Episcopal Church's House of Bishops.

Margaret has spoken at climate justice rallies, conferences, and public vigils, testified at public hearings about state energy policy, fasted in front of the White House, led prayerful marches and vigils, and taken part in ecumenical and interfaith delegations to urge climate justice. The author of numerous books and articles and an active participant in environmental movements, Margaret lives with her husband Robert A. Jonas in Northampton, Massachusetts, and is working with him to help preserve farmlands, fields, and woodlands in the Pioneer Valley.

MARY LUTI

GUEST PREACHER—JULY 22, 2018

From 1984-98, Rev. Dr. J. Mary Luti taught the History of Christianity at Andover Newton Theological School while also serving as Director of the Center for Ministry of the Laity and as Associate Dean for Academic programs. In 2000, she was called as Senior Minister of First Church in Cambridge, UCC - its first (and only) woman pastor in 377 years of continuing congregational life. In 2008, after an intense period of congregational renewal and growth, Mary returned to Andover Newton, where she was appointed the first Director of the Wilson Chapel and Visiting Professor of Worship and Preaching. Her teaching has centered on the many ways people of faith have sung, prayed, preached, shaped communities, and handed down the meaningful traditions of the Christian church over the centuries.

Mary is also a founding member of The Daughters of Abraham, a growing network of interfaith women’s book groups, whose mission is to provide a replicable grassroots platform for greater understanding, respect, and reconciliation among women of the Abrahamic faiths.

Hello everyone!

May is a busy month! Spring is springing; the world gets moving - busy bees, busy hands, busy feet. And none are busier than the hands and feet of our Sunday school children.

On May 6th, we held our annual Mini-Walk for Hunger. It was a drizzly morning but that didn't dampen the spirits of our walkers or slow them down in the least. Seven kids followed the 1/2 mile route through our beautiful garden cemetery for a total of 32 laps. Those 14 feet walked a combined total of 16 miles! Great job! Thank you to the people of West Parish church who supported the children's effort that morning by contributing to the "loot in the boot", donating \$221. This money is sent to Project Bread in Boston to feed people in need throughout Massachusetts.

On May 20th, our ever popular Pizza Pig Out fundraiser took place in Fellowship Hall during coffee hour. This was the 6th time this event has taken place since 2012. It was by far the BIGGEST Pizza Pig Out we have had. I have to say that the fact that the Men's group chose that same Sunday to celebrate and give out scholarships to 18 amazing recipients from the Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence greatly contributed to the number of attendees! It was a wonderful morning of celebration all around. We had 20 children participate in the making of pizza (putting on all your favorite toppings), creating beautiful placemats that adorned the tables and writing the word "welcome" in 7 languages on place cards set at each place - this was for Pentecost, when "...each one heard their own language being spoken" (Acts2:6). They also helped serve the pizza to everyone. The generosity of our members and guests is incredible! This year, through your donations, we raised \$538. Yes, you read that right...\$538! Thank you doesn't seem like enough but THANK YOU! This money will be given to Happy Hands (Manos Felices) in Lawrence for the children who attend the after school and summer programs at Hancock Courts and, soon a second location at the Stadium Projects. Who knows, perhaps in a few years, some of these very children may attend the Boys and Girls Club and go on to be the recipients of scholarships from the Men's group? It could happen. The spirit of giving is one big circle. Good gets passed on and on and on...and comes back to us, too...in the form of smiles, and just a warm feeling within us.

MUSIC DIRECTOR SEARCH

The impact of a vital ministry of music is of great value to congregations. The strength and spirit of worship is greatly enhanced by the talent, skill and dependability of the church music director. Therefore the Governing Board is going to pursue a comprehensive approach to finding our next Music Director. This will include conducting 3 feedback circles in order to hear directly from the Congregation their thoughts and hopes around music in and outside of the Worship experience. A 5 member Search Committee will be appointed to assimilate the feedback from the circles and use it to inform the creation of a job description and prioritize skills/qualities desirable in our next Music Director. The Search Committee will recruit and interview candidates in order to identify a candidate for the position. While we would like a new Director as soon as possible, this intentional approach will take some time and we anticipate that it could be well into the Fall before an offer of employment is made.
