SUNDAY SCHOOL 2018-19

- Sunday School takes place during the worship service on Sunday mornings from September - June.

- There are two classrooms, one for children 4 years - 2nd Grade, and one for children in 3rd Grade and up.
- There is no Sunday School on the First Sunday of the Month. Children are invited to the intergenerational worship service.
